

# Scale Challenge #4

## Tenor Sax

Technique for Band

This Scale Challenge will really test your ability to play in all 12 keys! Each direction change is in a new key. Memorize this Challenge to develop even more skill.

Remember: All 12 Every Day!

### Part 1

Part 1 consists of four staves of music, each representing a different key signature. The first staff is in C major (no sharps or flats). The second staff is in B-flat major (two flats). The third staff is in A major (three sharps). The fourth staff is in G major (one sharp). ### Part 2
